MESSAGE FROM PASTOR HANS Dear Friends.

In my home country of Austria, we like to shoot off fireworks, play pranks, and, strangest of all, we melt lead tokens and pour the lead into cold water, and then we try to fathom from the shapes what the New Year will bring. In America, time honored traditions are to gather, watch the ball drop on Broadway in New York, toot horns, and get more or less senselessly drunk. (We do that in Austria, too; it just is not quite as center stage.)

A universal custom at this time is to make New Years resolutions. If I look back over the years, I proudly can claim that I kept them all. Yes, they are neatly filed in chronological order in a manila envelope in my filing cabinet. When I was a student one year I decided to come up with resolutions that I actually might keep. So I resolved I would drink as much as I could, smoke as much as I could, and have as much fun as I could. And what did God do? That year I met my wife; she very rapidly dried me up, stopped my smoking, and let us just say, the meaning of the word fun radically changed. Simply put, suddenly I had no more time for cigarettes and beer.
